Feast of the Ascension

Minority Influence Campaigns: Miss Amunikoro

The Year 12 Psychology classes have been learning about **Minority Influence** strategies Minority groups can use in order to influence the Majority to adopt their view points - leading to in some cases social change! Minority influence is a type of social influence, just as conformity and obedience are. Whereas conformity describes a process by which a majority can influence the beliefs and behaviour of others, minority influence describes the process by which an individual or small group of people persuades others to adopt their attitudes. or behaviours. While beliefs. conformity often leads to compliance, minority influence tends to result in internalisation, or conversion. A minority is most likely to influence others if it displays Consistency, Commitment, and Flexibility.

I set my class the task of creating a campaign in order to raise awareness on an issue in school that they were passionate about and felt needed to change and persuade members of the SLT (inc. Mrs Laws and Mr Delf) to make this change happen. This was set as homework in which they had a week to complete and present infront of 'board members' (My Year 12 HSC class and Miss Duncan!) who had to score them on: Apperance, Oral delivery, Subject Matter and overall persuasiveness!







The Hate u give.



This year alone they have had over 300 opportunities to apply for, including; taster days, industry visits, subject conferences, work experience placements, master classes plus lots more.


We have had careers talks from 20 of our very successful alumni on very many subjects including, actuarial science, accounting, architecture, psychology engineering and many more.








"Timo Werner joined 60 local school students at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium as they celebrated completing the Premier League Inspires personal development programme this week.

- A presentation by author Paul Wakefield on his book 'Mindful Mornings'








NHS Blood Type Event




Holy Family Alumni






