

Year 7 Science


This half-term, class 7i have been learning about specialised cells. At the end of their learning they were asked to produce a poster on a specialised cell of their choice.

A huge well done from Miss Anjorin who was very impressed with the work that the class produced.








Year 8 Literacy Projects




Local Black History Tour

When asked about the party, Miss Joseph said "The party was amazing! The students were fabulous and the children from OLSG were lovely singing."


Well done to all involved for embracing the Catholic Ethos of Holy Family and volunteering to help make the events so successful.



Students were really engaged in the interactive workshops, which got them thinking about their own futures (both short and long term).










