In 1300, Pope Boniface VIII instituted the first Christian Jubilee, and since then the Church as designated each new Jubilee as a special year of grace and forgiveness, offering the faithful an expositivity to obtain a planety indulgance, a special grace that opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence - a special grace that strengthens our wounded souls in the fight against sin.
