## Headteacher's Update

Dear Parents/Carers,

Public examinations began in earnest this week, with Year 11 sitting their first RE paper yesterday and Biology today. I have been very impressed with the commitment and positive attitude of our students and their readiness for their exams. The LRC and Lecture Theatre have been open from 7.30 each morning with staff on hand to support, reassure and give last-minute exam tips. Snacks and drinks are available. At 8.20, students are brought to the Assembly Hall to register and receive exam reminders from Heads of Department; they are then escorted to the exam Hall. Please support this process by ensuring that your child arrives in plenty of time and is properly equipped with a black pen, pencil, ruler, any specialist equipment such as calculators and a bottle of water with the label removed.

On Friday 17th May, the school will be closed for all students apart from those sitting exams that day. This is as a mark of respect for Mrs Anjorin and her family, as Daniel's funeral takes place on that day. A number of staff, including myself, will be attending.

Students who have examinations on Friday 17th May should come into school as usual to prepare for their examination.

Lunch will be available for those who have an afternoon examination.

Work for all other students will be set on Google classroom. Please see the school website for information on how to access Google classroom or email your child's Head of Year.

Thank you to parents who have sent in cards for Mrs Anjorin; there are books of condolence at reception on both sites for staff, students and parents to write messages for the Anjorin family. We welcome parents who wish to come in and leave a message to do so.

Finally, a reminder that mobile phones and smart watches are strictly prohibited in school. If found they will be confiscated for two weeks and only returned to a parent/carer. This is clearly stated in our behaviour policy, which can be found on the school website. Please support us by ensuring that your child does not bring such items into school.

We will be reminding students of our policy in the weeks before the half term break and will be strictly enforcing it.
