Headteacher's Update

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope this message finds you and your families well.

It has been a successful and focused start to the A Level and GCSE examination season this week, and I want to commend our students for the calm, mature and determined approach they have shown. Our Year 12 students have also completed their PPE (prepublic examinations) exams this week, and we are proud of how seriously they have taken this important step in their preparation for next year's final exams.

This week also marks Mental Health Awareness Week, and across the school we have been encouraging students to reflect on their wellbeing, talk openly about mental health, and explore ways to support both themselves and one another. It has been uplifting to see students engage with these important messages through assemblies, tutor time activities and drop-in sessions.

As we approach the final weeks of this half term, I want to take the opportunity to remind families of the importance of maintaining high standards in attendance, punctuality, behaviour, and uniform. It can be tempting to lose focus as we near the break, but it is vital that all students continue to make the most of every learning opportunity.

Looking ahead, formal assessments for Years 7 and 8 will begin during the week commencing Monday 2nd June. These will provide a valuable snapshot of progress and help inform teaching and support moving forward. Year 10 students will be sitting their mock exams during the week commencing Monday 16th June, and should now be entering the revision phase to ensure they are fully prepared.

Just a few important reminders regarding safety and conduct:

- Please reiterate with your child the importance of being aware of their safety on the way home: we ask all our students to make their way directly home and not to gather or congregate in public spaces.
- Roller skates should not be brought into school.
- Our students represent the school when they are wearing our uniform therefore any behaviour outside of school that brings the school into disrepute will be sanctioned.
- Mobile phones are not allowed in school and will be confiscated for up to two weeks if found, and only returned to a parent/carer by appointment.

Finally, we have been marking May as the month of Our Lady by saying the traditional Memorare prayer in all RE lessons this half term. We ask Mary to bless our school community in the month of May and over the summer term.
