
HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

St Patrick's Day

St Patrick's Day is, of course, the 17th March, which this year falls on Sunday.

St. Patrick is one of the world's most popular saints. He was born in Roman Britain and when he was fourteen or so, he was captured by Irish pirates during a raiding party and taken to Ireland as a slave to herd and tend sheep. At the time, Ireland was a land of Druids and pagans but Patrick turned to God and wrote his memoir, The Confession. In The Confession, he wrote: "The love of God and his fear grew in me more and more, as did the faith, and my soul was rosed, so that, in a single day, I have said as many as a hundred prayers and in the night, nearly the same. I prayed in the woods and on the mountain, even before dawn. I felt no hurt from the snow or ice or rain." St Patrick often used shamrocks to explain the Holy Trinity and entire kingdoms were eventually converted to Christianity after hearing Patrick's message. Patrick preached and converted all of Ireland for 40 years. He worked many miracles and wrote of his love for God in Confessions. After years of living in poverty, travelling and enduring much suffering he died on March 17, 461.

St Patrick is the patron saint of Ireland, Nigeria and also the patron saint of engineers among others.

Will Tracy's new status as a teen sensation be enough to topple Corny's reigning dance queen and bring racial integration to the show?


Everyone joined in with the singing and we were treated to a wonderful performance from year 2 OLSG.

Our winner was Angelina in year 8 who memorised 226 digits of Pi! That is a fantastic effort and is a school record - Well done Angelina!





Born in Roman Britain in the late 4th century, he was kidnapped at the age of 16 and taken to Ireland as a slave. He escaped but returned about 432 to convert the Irish to Christianity.

By the time of his death on March 17, 461, he had established monasteries, churches and schools. Many legends grew up around him – for example, that he drove the snakes out of Ireland and used the shamrock to explain the Trinity.



Your teenager will learn essential life skills from local business leaders and charities, gain confidence in public speaking, communications skills and budgeting. These skills are the perfect addition to a CV or personal statement.

Action

Staying at home for this phase, your teenager and their team will devise a social action project based on an issue they feel passionate about after being partnered with a local charity. This is their chance to feel proud by making a real difference in their community.

Celebration

In such a short period of time they'll have overcome challenges, pushed themself into new and exciting territories, and had experiences they never thought possible. So now it's time to come together and celebrate! They'll also be offered a variety of voluntary and work opportunities.

How do I sign up?

We have 12 available start dates for you to choose from, then you complete your payment and young person's medical information online.
