



The general election

As they say on Strictly Come Dancing, the results are in and the outcome of the election is a massive Labour landslide with 72% of the vote! Oh, sorry that's the results of Holy Family's mock election. Students and staff here voted in large numbers - the turnout was about 70% and the Labour Party won in every year group and among the staff. Politics students will know there is a long-standing correlation between age and likelihood of voting Labour or Conservative. Younger people tend to vote Labour, while older people are more likely to vote Conservative and, in fact, more likely to vote.

Meanwhile in the general election the result has been the return of a Conservative government with a clear majority. This means we shall be leaving the European Union and we shall have to see what it means for education, health and other public services.

First, from Mrs Perera who nominates **Gabriella Francis and Tiara Davis**, both in



































WORSHIPFUL COMPANY OF INVESTMENT BANKERS

YEAR 12 FILM STUDIES TRIP TO THE BFI

Silent Film Day

Last Friday, the Year 12 Film Studies class went on a trip to the British Film Institute on the Southbank whereby we took part in a Silent Film Study Day. The event was held in a huge auditorium, where we were given presentations surrounding different aspects of Silent Films, including their historical context and aesthetics. The speaker introduced us to three significant film movements: Realism, German Expressionism and Russian Constructivism. We discovered the various micro elements surrounding each of the movements as well as widened our knowledge and understanding of the social constructs surrounding each film movement. We also compared ideals of modern films to those of silent films, allowing us to understand that despite the massive technological advancements in films, techniques from the Silent Era, are still used often today.

Furthermore, we watched a screening of 'The General', directed by Buster Keaton, accompanied with live music by a professional pianist. This enabled us to watch the film as if we were part of an audience in the 1920s, which was an amazing and diverse experience as we were all in awe of the pianist's skills. The screening was followed by a Q&A, where we found out more about the musician's career, even discovering that most of his work is through improvisation! Overall, the trip was highly useful in widening our knowledge of the periods surrounding Silent Film, not only assisting us in our A-Level Film Studies course, but it was also extremely informative and interesting. - Chloe C

The Year 10 Retreat Day took place this week. The theme was Peace and Forgiveness. Students joined the parish Mass at Our Lady & St George and during the Homily Fr Niall spoke about however hard it is to forgive, we have to, otherwise the person we can't forgive continues their life as normal but we are all consumed by the wrong they did us and it eats away inside us.

One thing he said that resonated with many of us was "forgive the sinner, hate the sin". Forgiveness does not mean forgetting, nor does it mean condoning or excusing.



The day continued with a talk from CAFOD about climate change and how it can cause conflict and another workshop on child soldiers. We were also joined by Youthwave who asked "how do you react to conflict in your own lives". Year 10 also had the opportunity to let go and forgive, times when they have been wronged and are hurt, angry or bearing a grudge and to ask God to help let go of these feelings.



Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, how many times should I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Should I forgive as many as 7 times?"

Jesus said, "Not just 7 times, but rather as many as 77 times." (Matthew 18.21-22)
