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

# HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

#### St Ignatius House celebration day

As you'll be aware every member of Holy Family is a member of a House. We have six houses each named after a saint: St Anne, St Stephen, St Philomena, St Ignatius, St Richard and St Elizabeth. Together the initials of these saints spell the motto of the school 'ASPIRE'. Each House has a celebration day and we marked the first of these in the school calendar on Thursday of this week. All the members of St Ignatius House attended the morning Mass in the parish church of Our Lady and St George and then came over to the lower site to have lunch together and also for what has become the traditional House treat - an ice cream paid for by the Friends of Holy Family. The students behaved impeccably in Mass and it was a very spiritual and reflective occasion. Thanks to Fr Niall for inviting us to the parish Mass.

# HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

#### Sustainability

We are designating this academic year as Holy Family's 'Year of Sustainability'. Over the summer holiday we had a range of low energy lighting installed. This is part of a government backed scheme whereby schools are loaned the money to replace their existing lighting with low energy lighting. Over an eight year period the savings in electricity costs cover the repayment of the loan, so there is no net cost to the school. This will help to reduce our carbon footprint. We've also installed more energy efficient boilers in recent years and improved insulation around the school.

We will be working with the students on a number of other ideas including how to reduce the amount of singleuse plastic discarded in the school, improving the external environment and developing a vegetable garden on each site where we are able to grow food that can be cooked in the school and/or taken home for use there. We are also working on recycling schemes and ending the use of plastic cutlery over the coming weeks and months. We won't get all this done at once, but we want the students to lead the way and we want to make sure we are following Pope Francis's example to 'live simply' and to make sure we care for this amazing planet that we all must share and live together on.

#### Show My Homework

Apologies that we had some technical problems with the Show My Homework software at the start of term. This is now up and running again and is a very useful way of keeping track of your son/daughter's homework. #### Parking

Please note we have no car-parking at all for visitors and cars are not permitted to enter the school grounds before, or after school.

## The importance of attendance and punctuality

High attendance is vitally important if students are to do well in their education. It should go without saying that every student should aim for a minimum attendance of at least 95%.

Last year, almost one in ten Holy Family students had 100% attendance for the entire year. This is an excellent achievement and reflects very well on each of them. Of course, there will be students who are genuinely ill and unable to attend school at times, but it is also part of life that we should try to attend when we may not feel absolutely 100%, but do not want to miss out on learning. We monitor every student's attendance and punctuality very closely and work with parents and students to improve attendance when it is not good enough. Remember 90% is a great score in an exam, but it represents a poor figure for attendance since 90% attendance means a day missed every fortnight.

## Open Evening for prospective Yr 7 students (2020 intake)

Our Open Evening takes place at the end of the month, on Thursday 26th September at 6pm. We will again be able to offer additional places for next September as the school expands, so please do spread the word and encourage your friends and family to apply to our school if they would like to do so. You do not need to be Catholic to attend Holy family and we welcome applications from people of all faiths, or indeed, no faith. We are a very diverse community and everyone finds their place here.

For this year we still have a few vacancies in Yr 7 and, if you know someone who wishes to apply, then please ask them to contact the borough's admissions office. They are, of course, also welcome to make contact with us too and should ask for Deputy Head (Head of Lower School) Mr Murphy.

#### Parents' surgery

Parents' surgery is every Thursday from 4pm to 5pm on the Walthamstow site. For those new to the school, parents' surgery presents an opportunity to see me, as the headteacher, without an appointment about any concerns that you may have. If ever I am unavailable, a member of the senior team substitutes for me.




### *Chaplaincy* Corner

## Mr Gerry Breen RIP

As Dr Stone reported in Family Matters last week, during the summer holidays we learned the sad news of the death of Mr Breen, Headteacher of Holy Family from 1992-2007. His funeral took place this week, which was a sad occasion but also a chance to celebrate his life.

Mr Breen was born in Northern Ireland where he began his teaching career. He later moved to England, where he taught English and drama in many schools, including in Waltham Forest before settling at Holy Family. His hard work and leadership during his time as Headteacher transformed our school community and laid many of the foundations that Dr Stone was able to build on to enable us to become the excellent school that we are today. Mr Breen would always go out of his way to help students, staff and parents in any way that he could – he would never turn anyone away who needed his help or advice.

A significant number of current members of staff attended Holy Family as students while Mr Breen was the Headteacher

and many more now have children who attend Holy Family today - clearly the 'family' nature of Holy Family that Mr Breen nurtured lives on very strongly in the ethos of the school as a Catholic community. Mr Breen's favourite poem was Digging by Seamus Heaney: Between my finger and my thumb The squat pen rests; snug as a gun.

Under my window, a clean rasping sound When the spade sinks into gravelly ground: My father, digging. I look down

Till his straining rump among the flowerbeds Bends low, comes up twenty years away Stooping in rhythm through potato drills Where he was digging.

The coarse boot nestled on the lug, the shaft Against the inside knee was levered firmly. He rooted out tall tops, buried the bright edge deep To scatter new potatoes that we picked, Loving their cool hardness in our hands.

*By God*, *the old man could handle a spade. Just like his old man.* 

My grandfather cut more turf in a day Than any other man on Toner's bog. Once I carried him milk in a bottle Corked sloppily with paper. He straightened up To drink it, then fell to right away Nicking and slicing neatly, heaving sods Over his shoulder, going down and down For the good turf. Digging.

The cold smell of potato mould, the squelch and slap Of soggy peat, the curt cuts of an edge Through living roots awaken in my head. But I've no spade to follow men like them.

Between my finger and my thumb The squat pen rests. I'll dig with it. YEAR 11


