


HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE



Deloitte Technology, Media and Telecommunications Challenge

The Deloitte Technology, Media and Telecommunications Challenge is an exciting opportunity where teams are able to develop skills in communication and presenting, while also gaining an insight into the future trends that are shaping our world. This year's theme is based around the smartphone multiplier market. Last Wednesday, three groups presented their ideas to members of the Deloitte company, who were judging us based on our research, innovation, scalability and the social impact of our products.







Team 'Sonorous' invented the idea of solar powered earphones with a biodegradable case that doubles as a portable charger for your phone. The group focused on the environmental benefits of the product, considering the climate crisis occurring currently, and excellently highlighted the earplug's social impact.



Team 'Lightbulb' focused their product on education and schooling. They invented an app named 'Studioso' whereby students are able to revise through the song of their choice. For example, they would be able to transfer their notes into a favourite song, allowing them to memorise the notes in a quicker and more fun way!

Team Ability's product was earplugs visually impaired; the for the product reflects upon the hardships of those with sight problems, and aims to help them in order to gain some independence. The earplugs GPS device, modes of а have communication and many more aspects to help the visually impaired. The group focused mainly on the social impact of this product, and how it would help so many people in the long term.

The winning teams were 'Ability' and 'Sonorous' who will be merging together and going to the next round, where they will present in front of companies such as Google and Amazon!!
