# HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

#### A month of remembrance

All our Yr 7-11 students attend the Mass and our Yr 13s attend as it will be their last whole school Mass as well as some representatives of Yr 12. During the Mass we remember former staff and students who have died and also all our own family members and friends. It is always a very moving occasion and this year it is sad that our former headteacher. Mr Breen and former PE teacher Miss Simpson were added to the list.



#### **St Elizabeth House Celebration**

#### **The General Election**

So, we are having a general election on Thursday 12th December 2019. It will be the third election in four years, which is unusual for the United Kingdom, These are, though, unusual times. Mr Shah and his colleagues in the History and Politics Department have prepared some fantastic resources to teach students about the election and we will be holding a mock election ourselves. Some of our Yr 13s will be old enough to vote and we are encouraging everyone eligible to ensure they are registered and that they use their vote. Despite its flaws and the problems we have experienced over Brexit, our democracy is important and precious.

Too many people live in countries where there is no right to vote, no rule of law and no opportunity to choose or remove political leaders. Winston Churchill described democracy as "the worst form of government except for all the other forms that have been tried" and that is an interesting way to think about it.

We have a very successful and high-achieving sixth form and we take applications from our own Yr 11 students and also students from other schools at the end of Yr 11. 


