School updates

Attendance

Attendance rates have been really high in school since we returned last week which I'm delighted about. The students (and staff) are really happy to be back at school, to be able to see their friends, learn face to face and enjoy a semblance of normality. It's been lovely to see the students on the lower site playing games in the playground and being 'normal' children and young people. We know that Covid is not beaten and the pandemic is not over. We continue to ensure our control measures are in place including hand-washing, mask wearing and social distancing where possible.

Testing for Covid

Lateral Flow Tests have again been carried out this week on all year groups. There have been no positive cases this week. The third round of testing is next week and thereafter parents are expected to test their own children twice weekly.

Interventions

We started our interventions programme on Friday and there are a range of different sessions for students in each year group. We have communicated with students and parents about who is receiving intervention. This is one of the strands included in what we call the catch-up curriculum. The catch-up curriculum includes all the measures we are taking to support our students and ensure that they do not fall behind. Intervention sessions are there to help support every student make sure that everyone is able to stay on track with their studies.

Remote parents evening for Yr 10 parents

We have our first remote parents evening for Yr 10 parents on Tuesday afternoon after school. Invitations have gone out and there has been a very good response so far with a large majority of parents signing up and making appointments. This will be the first occasion when we have used this online system and we hope that it works well and will prove to be convenient for everyone.

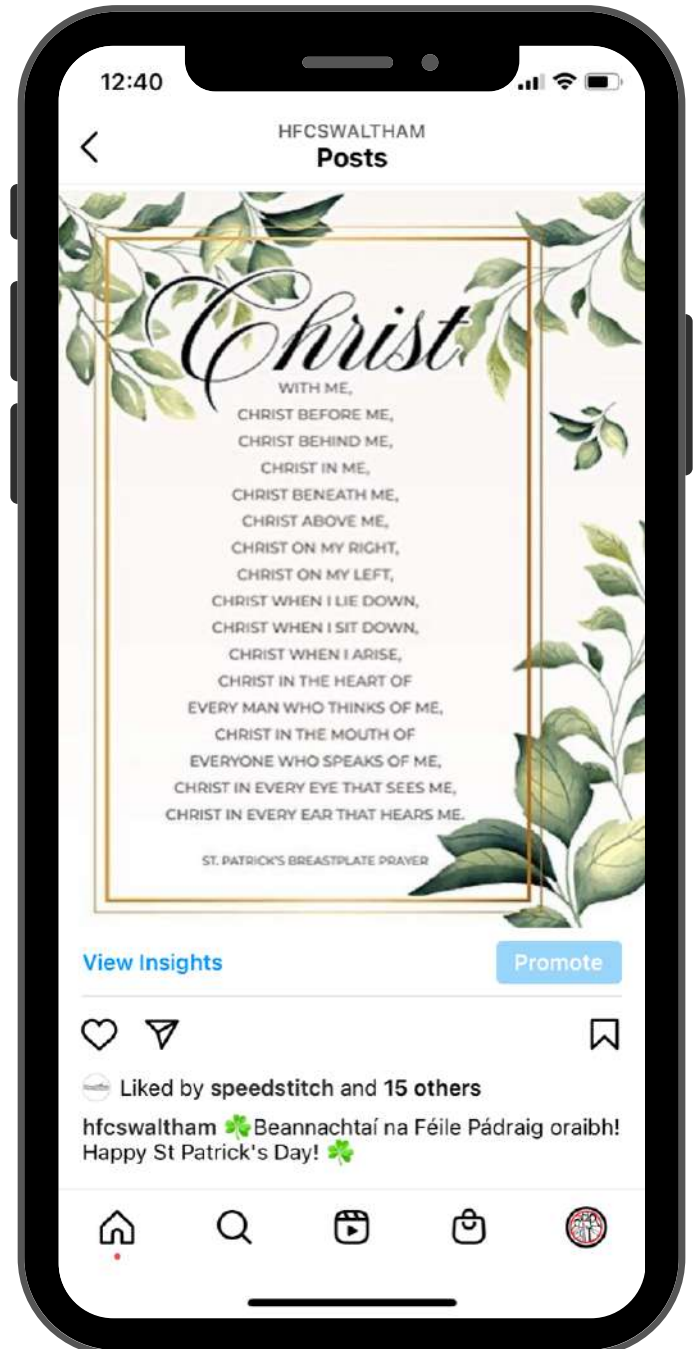

SiLENT provides grants to young people throughout the country to help in their local area.

Young people such as Shanea Oldham, aged 18 and a 6th form student at St Bonaventure’s in Forest Gate. Shanea was spurred into action after a teenager was stabbed in her neighbourhood. She went to help him lying in the street and what she witnessed left a huge mark on her. She vowed to put an end to the increasing amount of violence in Newham.

She began working with the police to act as a liaison between them and young people to improve stop and search perceptions and she also arranged for a Red Cross instructor to come in to provide First Aid training to 6th form students in school so they knew how to deal with stab injuries and potentially save a life.

This week, we hear how Jesus teaches his disciples about the way in which he will be glorified by God, and a voice from heaven is heard to affirm this teaching.

Family life is often a balancing act in which we prioritise and attend to a variety of competing needs. We learn the value of putting others’ needs ahead of our own. In family life we also learn that we make personal sacrifices to serve others, we gain so much more than we may have lost.

CLASSROOM CONSCIOUSNESS

THE RISE IN ANTI-ASIAN
HATE CRIMES

Amid the Covid-19 pandemic there has been an explicit increase in hate crimes, racism and discrimination towards Asians, East Asians specifically. Racism within and towards the Asian community is almost normalised and many fail to recognise the extent of their word choices towards Asians. Asians tend to face micro aggressions; people subconsciously or consciously using derogatory and racial terms such as 'ling ling' and 'chink,' which are often, used indiscriminately against the east Asian community. Major aggressions and even attempts of murder has been displayed against the East Asian community with many being spat at, harassed or attacked and even recently killed. Internationally, there has been a 150% increase of hate crimes against East Asians, just in 2020, highlighting the effect the pandemic has brought amongst the community, with being called the 'Chinese virus.'

The rapid increase in hate crimes against the community quite easily expresses and highlights the xenophobic atmosphere today. Many people still can't accept that countries are becoming more and more diverse with different ethnic groups and cultures flooding the western world today. This needs to stop immediately. Minority groups should not be targeted or discriminated against because of their difference in culture and ethnic background. How are they supposed to feel safe and valuable in a country or community where their people are continuously being killed and harassed just because of their ethnicity and background?

In order to support the East Asian community, those who are specifically targeted, and further signify our acceptance and alliance within the community, we can donate to Asian charities: 'enough is enough' and think! Chinatown.' Finally, we should continue to support and buy from local and extensive Asian restaurants, to empathise our support, as there has also been a sudden decrease in buying from East Asian restaurants or stores.

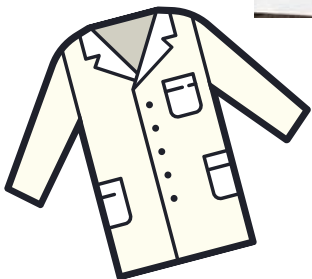
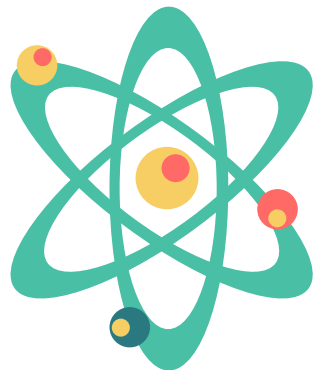
