Quotation of the week

"In the name of God and in the name of this suffering people whose cries rise to heaven more loudly each day, I beg you, I implore you, I order you, in the name of God, stop the repression!" The words of Archbishop Oscar Romero to soldiers in El Salvador in 1980. The next day Archbishop Romero was shot and killed while celebrating Mass in his cathedral.

Holy Week

On Friday we had a virtual live streamed whole school assembly on Holy Week. As we come to the end of our Lenten journey we find ourselves marking Palm Sunday this Sunday. Palm Sunday is a day of triumph as Jesus is acclaimed by the people on his entry into Jerusalem. Holy Week marks how things go badly wrong for our Lord with his betrayal, false trial and eventual crucifixion and death. Thursday evening there is the Mass of the Lord's Supper and then of course the sadness of Good Friday before the joy of the resurrection on Easter Sunday.

Masses in school this week

This week we have held Masses of thanksgiving for our return to school for Yrs 7,8,9 and 10. Thanks to Canon Niall and Fr John for officiating. The Masses were all risk assessed and students wore masks throughout. It was wonderful to be able to celebrate Mass again in the school and for us to be able to receive Holy Communion.

We received a great response to our request for donations of clothing and household items and were able to help a number of our families in recent weeks. The remainder of the donated items are being collected by a parent who runs a charity in the Democratic Republic of Congo so it's good to know that everything we received will be made good use of.

Testing for covid

Lateral Flow Tests have been carried out for the final time in school this week on all year groups. There have again been no positive cases this week. We shall be writing to all parents to provide you with details about what you are now expected to do in terms of testing your children. The letter will give full details of this and provide all the information you need. Students will be bringing home test kits next week for use at home. Please do carry out these tests as they will identify any asymptomatic positive cases and help to keep everyone safe. Staff are testing themselves twice weekly at home too.

From our point of view we thought it was an effective and efficient way of enabling parents' evening to take place and I hope you found it useful. COMMENDATIONS

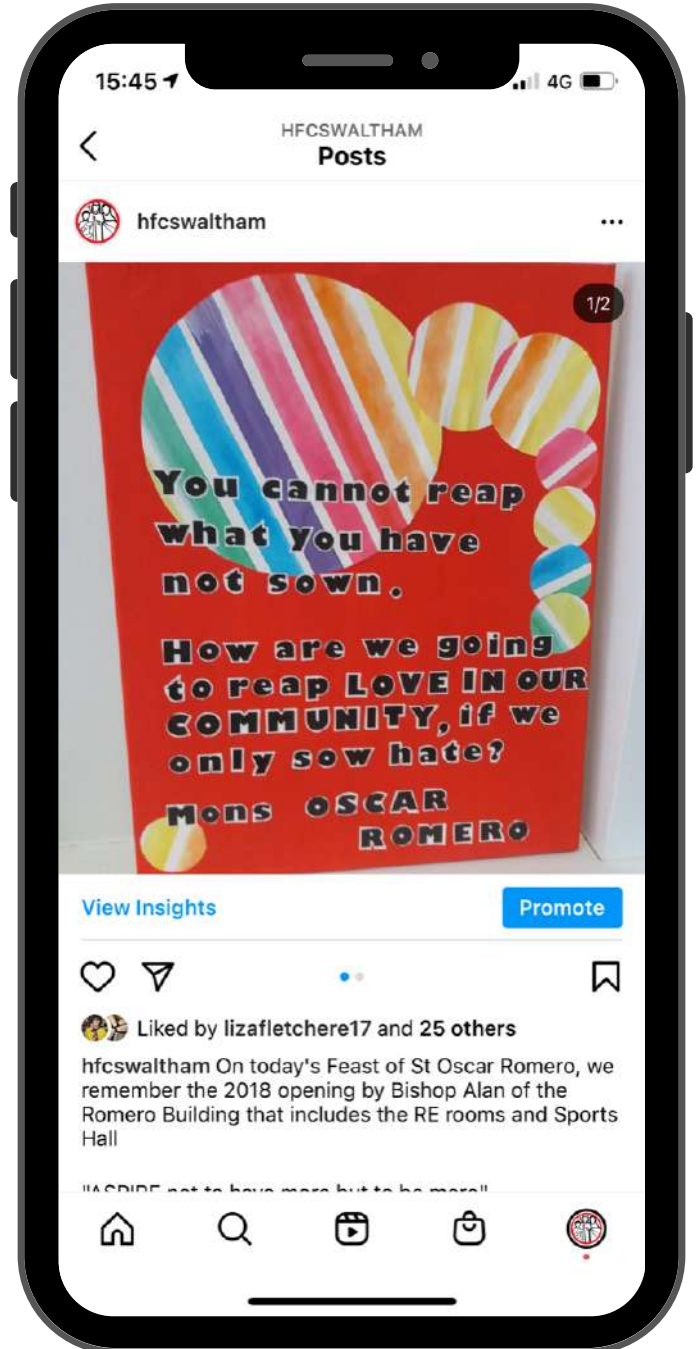



COVID TESTING

In order to keep our school as safe as possible we have spent the past 3 weeks carrying out COVID tests for consenting pupils across both our Walthamstow and Wiseman sites.

Pupils have had up to 3 tests over this period and from next week we will move to the testing-at-home programme.

It has been a challenging time balancing the need to minimise disruption to lessons whilst at the same time ensuring each pupil is given the appropriate support and guidance so they are able to complete the test safely and correctly.

All the people involved in the testing including staff within the school, colleagues and partners from LBWF and external agencies have been impressed with how well behaved the pupils have been - so much so that one of our testers would love to come back to Holy Family to become a trainee teacher in the future!

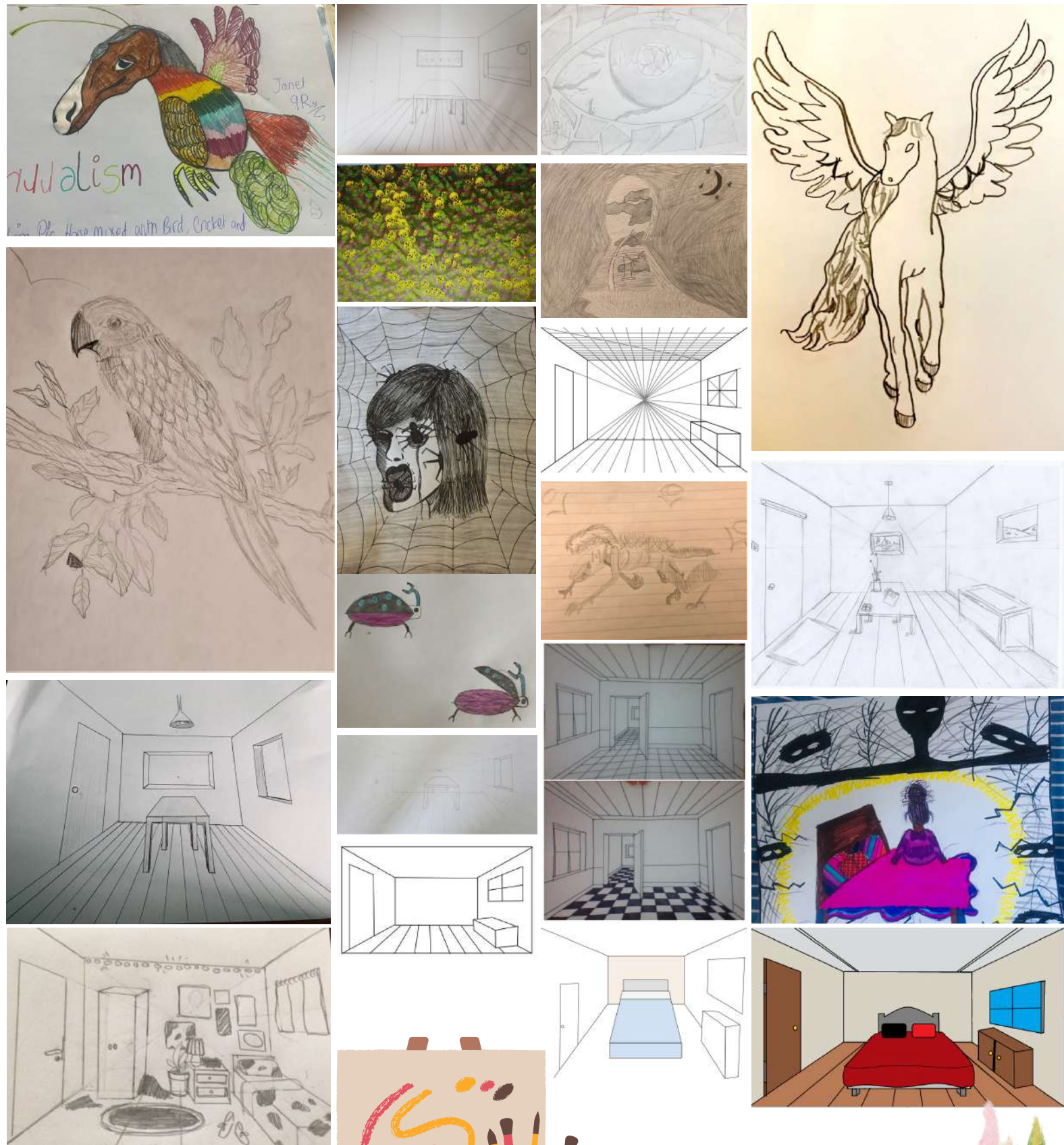

EGGS-PERIMENTS

1 BOUNCY EGG

WHAT YOU WILL NEED

- 1 egg (we recommend a white egg)
- A large container (a mason jar will work well)
- Bottle of white vinegar
- Food colouring (optional)

METHOD

- 1 Place your egg into the bottom of the large container. It is important that the egg is raw and not boiled.
- 2 Fill the container with white vinegar, or add enough so the egg is fully submerged.
- 3 *Optional step:* Add a few drops of food colouring to dye your egg.
- 4 Leave the egg for 24-48 hours to allow for the reaction to take place.
- 5 Take the egg out and swirl it under some running water. The shell should wash away leaving you with an egg that bounces.

The egg will still break if dropped from too high up so we recommend bouncing it from a low height or over a tray.

'Design A Lab Coat' competition entries for Science week

MAKING A LAVA LAMP

These simple steps will leave you with a mesmerising lava lamp you can use again and again. It is a quick and easy experiment for all ages.

WHAT YOU WILL NEED

- Screw-lid container
- Food colouring
- Water
- Vegetable oil
- Salt or an effervescent tablet


METHOD

- 1 Firstly, add water to your container until it is roughly a quarter full.
- 2 Next, add 10 drops of food colouring or until the colour is vibrant.
- 3 Top up your container with vegetable oil, leaving about a centimetre at the top. This will allow room for the gases produced and prevent your lava lamp from leaking.
- 4 To make your lava lamp bubble, add a teaspoon of salt or one crushed up effervescent tablet and screw the lid on tightly.

You can now sit back and relax, watching the colourful bubbles work their way up the oil and slowly sinking down again. If the process stops you can restart it again by adding more salt or another effervescent tablet.

THE SCIENCE BEHIND IT

A tablet that dissolves in water, and releases carbon dioxide which causes it to fizz.

Before the experiment commenced, I got together the supplies needed for this. The supplies I needed were water, red food colouring, sunflower oil and sea salt - this is the order I added each of them. I also needed a jar to place all these things in.

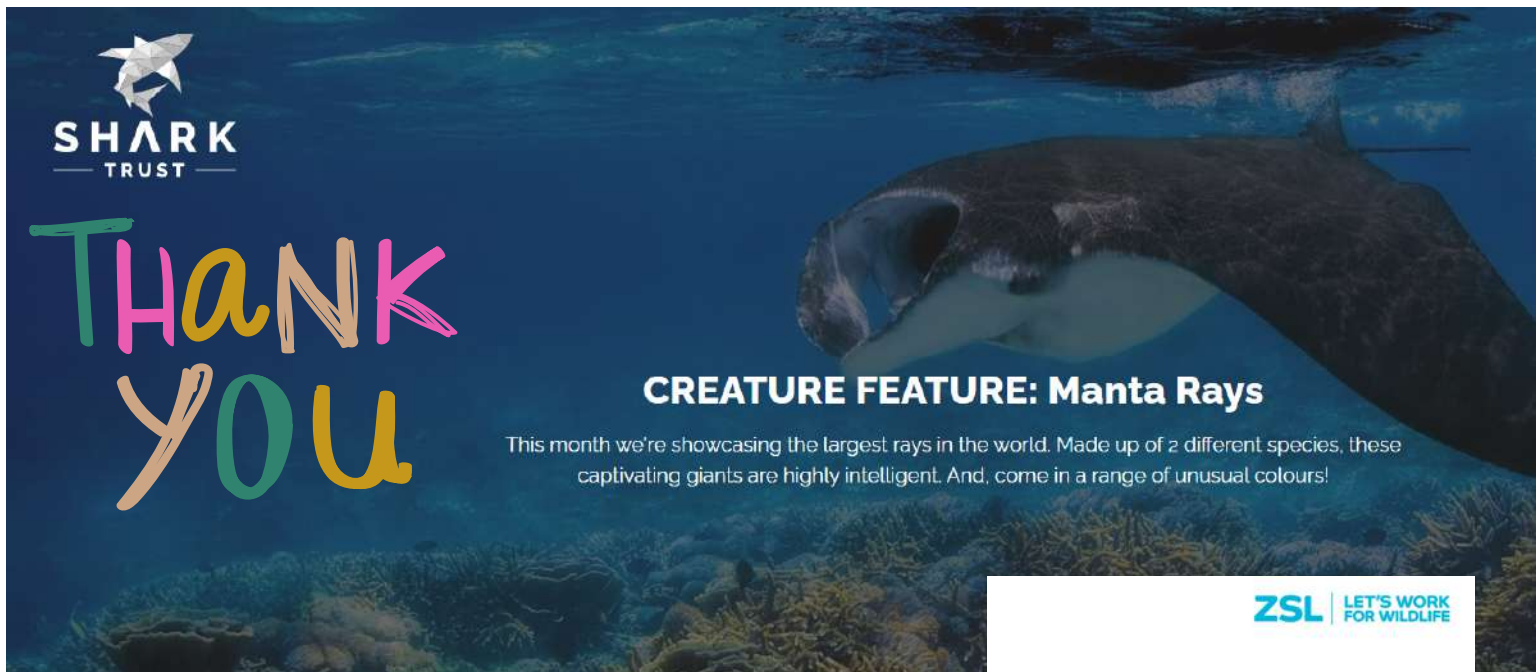
- $\frac{1}{3}$ of a jar full of water
- 5 drops of food colouring
- Rest of the jar with oil
- Add a bit of sea salt

When these were mixed it formed fizzing bubbles and looked like a volcano.
