



Bank Holiday Monday 3rd May 2021

Please remember there is no school on Monday as it is the May Day bank holiday. Pope Pius XII instituted the feast of Saint Joseph the Worker in 1955. This feast extends the long relationship between Joseph and the cause of workers in both Catholic faith and devotion. Beginning in the Book of Genesis, the dignity of human work has long been celebrated as a participation in the creative work of God. By work, humankind both fulfills the command found in Genesis to care for the earth (Gr 2:15) and to be productive in their labors. Saint Joseph, the carpenter and foster father of Jesus, is but one example of the holiness of human labour. Jesus, too, was a carpenter. He learned the trade from Saint Joseph and spent his early adult years working side-by-side in Joseph's carpentry shop before leaving to pursue his ministry as preacher and healer.

I'm delighted to inform parents that Holy Family continues to be an Investors in People Gold accredited school. We received notification of the extension of our award for a further three years earlier this month. This means that our emphasis on staff training and development is exceptional and reflects the excellent work that goes on in the school every day to help staff learn, develop new skills and constantly improve. Only 3% of schools attain Gold status so this is a great achievement for the school.



We also wish success to our Year 13s who are also sitting exams over the coming weeks.



Yr 9 Photograpy talk by Isha Shah and Sama Kai




Photography talk:





CREST helps young people become independent and reflective learners through enquiry-based project work.

The challenge Students work independently or in groups to plan and run a project addressing a real-world STEM problem. Students complete a 10-hour project which is a perfect introduction to STEM project work. Over the course of the project, teams of students design their own investigation, record their findings, and reflect on their learnings. The process gives students a taste of what it is like to be scientist or engineer in the real-world.

Student-led CREST is a nationally recognised scheme for student-led project work in the STEM subjects (science, technology, engineering and maths).

Flexible CREST gives young people aged 5–19 the chance to choose their own subject and methodology when completing their hands-on investigation.

Trusted It has been running since 1986 and sees tens of thousands of young people taking part each year.

Real world results Students who participate in CREST Silver achieve higher grades and are more likely to study STEM subjects at AS level.

The outcome The project process develops enquiry, problem-solving and communication skills. CREST Bronze can be used by students to enhance their personal CV and University Application. After completing the project, each student receives a personalised certificate


