

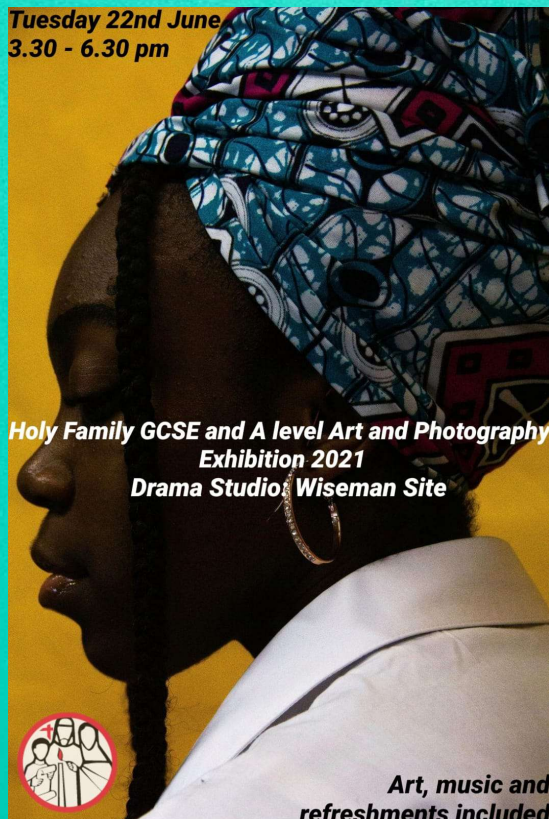

Carriageway Resurfacing 2020/21 – The Drive E17 (outside Fanshaw House & Batten House)

We will be resurfacing the carriageway on The Drive, outside Fanshaw House and Batten House.

This resurfacing works will be carried out in two phases. Where it is necessary, we may need to carry out some kerb works prior to this resurfacing day.

- Phase one - The Drive outside **Batten House** will be resurfaced on **Monday 21 June** between the hours of 8.30am and 5pm
- Phase two - The Drive outside **Fanshaw House** will be resurfaced on **Friday 25 June** between the hours of 8.30am and 5pm.

During the works the following temporary road changes will be in place and advance warning signs will be displayed in the area to let drivers know about these temporary changes.

- The Drive (outside Batten House) will be closed to all vehicles, except for emergency vehicles on Monday 21 June
- Parking will be suspended on The Drive (outside Batten House) on Monday 21 June between the hours of 8am to 5pm
- The Drive (outside Fanshaw House, Trinity House and Hancocke House) will be closed to all vehicles, except for emergency vehicles on Friday 25 June
- Parking will be suspended on The Drive (outside Trinity House and Hancocke House) on Friday 25 June between the hours of 8am to 5pm
- Parking will be suspended on The Drive (outside Fanshaw House) from Monday 21 June to Friday 25 June between the hours of 8am to 5pm
- Pedestrians will still be able to use the footways.

We will take additional measures during this carriageway resurfacing works to comply with the current COVID-19 government guidelines.

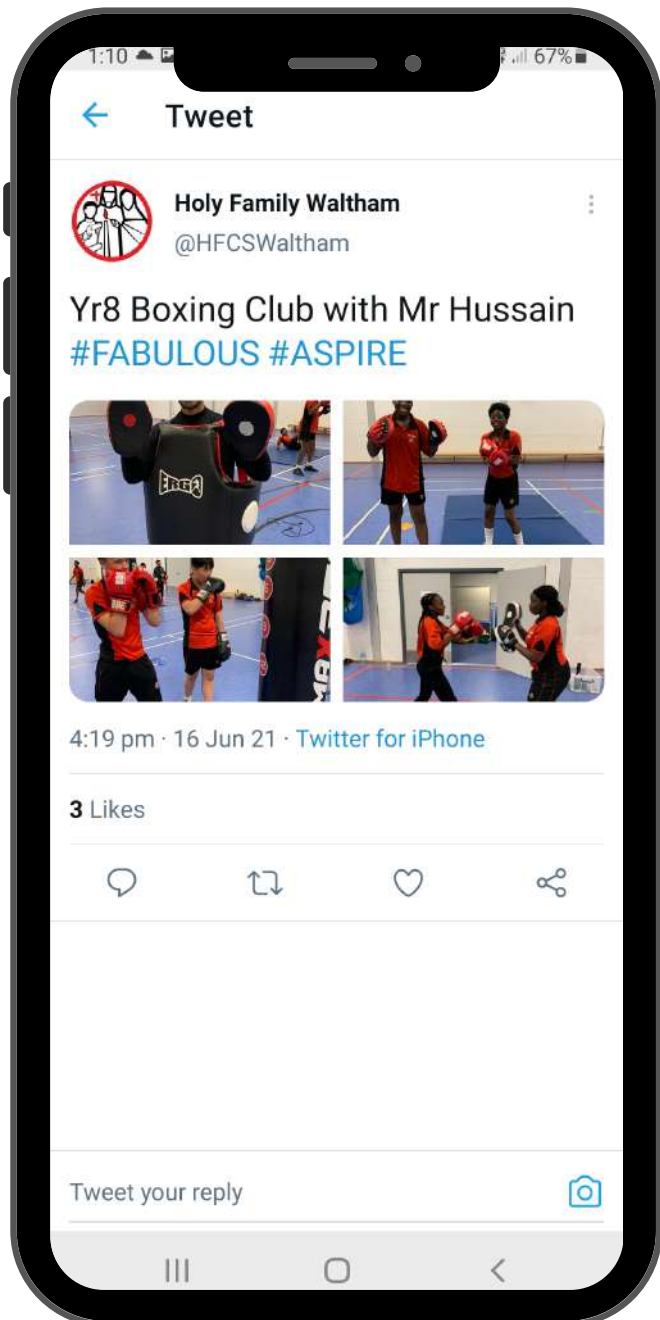

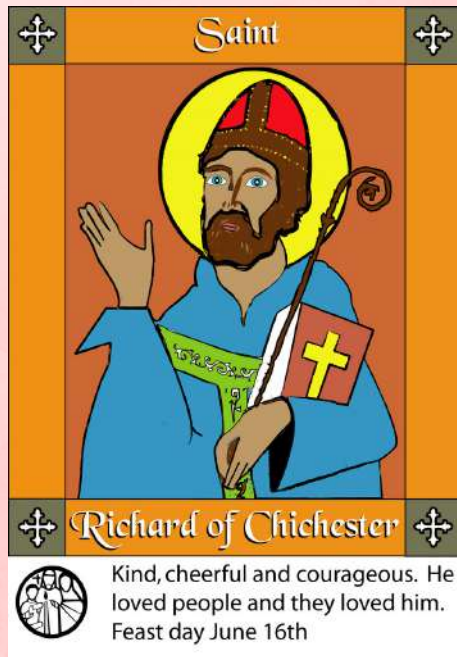

Happy Feast Day Richard House!

On Wednesday we celebrated the Feast Day of St Richard of Chichester. Born in 1197 to a land-owning, farming family. On the death of his father, he left to pursue his calling from God. He studied in Oxford, where he became the earliest Doctor of Canon Law.

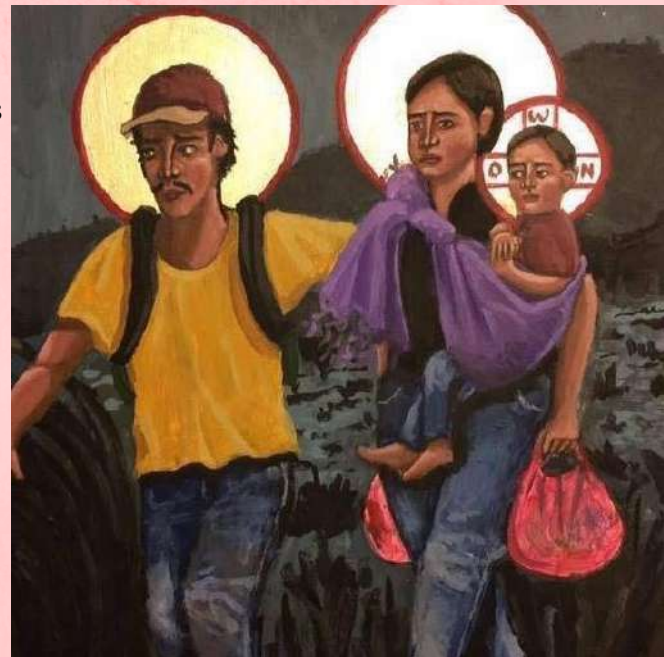
As Bishop of Chichester, his hospitality, teaching and patience won him the hearts of all who knew him and the apparent miracles performed by Richard set him apart from all other clergy. One miracle tells that Richard, celebrating Mass, dropped the chalice containing the consecrated wine. Amazingly, none was spilled.

He died on 3rd April, but as this date is usually during Lent, his Feast Day is celebrated on 16th June.

This week is **Refugee Week**, with World Refugee Day on Sunday 20 June. Movement is part of our shared human experience, and remembering this can help us connect with the journeys of people seeking safety. Many of us will know what it's like to be new somewhere, miss loved ones, to feel alone.

Refugee Week was the conversation theme for the **Year 9 Justice & Peace group**, many able to share their own family experiences. We thought about what we would take with us if we had to leave our home in a hurry – passport, medicine, mobile phone ... but what would we be leaving behind? We then thought about what small acts of kindness would make a difference to us in this situation – a warm blanket, a hot drink, water or a place to rest.
