

Thursday 24th June is the Nativity of St John the Baptist, a prophet who foretold the coming of the Messiah in the person of Jesus, whom he later baptised.


John the Baptist was the son of Zechariah, a priest, and his wife Elizabeth. Both were old and unable to have children. The Archangel Gabriel foretold John's birth to Zechariah while he was in the temple of Jerusalem. He announced to him that he and his wife would be blessed and give birth to a son, whom they should name John.

John the Baptist always spoke the truth about the Kingdom of God and how people should live in order to inherit it. He never shied away from confronting someone who went against the Will of God.



2021 has been proclaimed the "Year of St Joseph" and we have a display of Year 7 and 8 work in the foyer of the Walthamstow site.





STUDY TIP DON'T JUST REREAD BOOKS AND NOTES

IN ONE 2009 STUDY, SOME COLLEGE STUDENTS READ A TEXT TWICE. OTHERS READ A TEXT JUST ONCE. BOTH GROUPS TOOK A TEST RIGHT AFTER THE READING. TEST RESULTS DIFFERED LITTLE BETWEEN THESE GROUPS.

TOO OFTEN, WHEN STUDENTS REREAD MATERIAL. REREADING IS LIKE LOOKING AT THE ANSWER TO A PUZZLE, RATHER THAN DOING IT YOURSELF. IT LOOKS LIKE IT MAKES SENSE. BUT UNTIL YOU TRY IT YOURSELF, YOU DON'T REALLY KNOW IF YOU UNDERSTAND IT.

IN ONE 2010 STUDY COMPARED TEST RESULTS OF STUDENTS WHO REREAD MATERIAL TO TWO OTHER GROUPS. ONE GROUP WROTE QUESTIONS ABOUT THE MATERIAL. THE OTHER GROUP ANSWERED QUESTIONS FROM SOMEONE ELSE. THOSE WHO ANSWERED THE QUESTIONS DID BEST. THOSE WHO JUST REREAD THE MATERIAL DID WORST.





Yellow, golden sunset. The close of the day is ushered in, some things are always slightly open.





Dear Parent/Guardian,

We hope you are well and that your child/ren is enjoying the summer term and the warm weather!

Ahead of the summer holidays, we wanted to let you know about the brilliant new Holiday Activities and Food programme which is operating in your local area. We are helping to launch a new film to promote the programme so parents know that their children can get involved in a local holiday club when the school term ends this July.

We know that the holidays can be a really difficult time for families who are struggling to make ends meet or who are juggling work and childcare. The holidays should be a time for every child to enjoy themselves rather than worrying about having enough to eat or how they can spend their free time.

That's why we're really excited about the summer holiday programmes that are being funded by the Government and will take place across the whole of England. This was recommended by the National Food Strategy when it was published last year. A petition supporting the recommendation was signed by over 1 million people.

Places on the holiday schemes are available for free to children who receive free school meals, but children and young people of all ages and backgrounds are welcome to attend. Each local programme will provide delicious, healthy meals, allow kids to get active, help them learn new things, make friends and have fun. And that is what the holidays are all about!

The holiday programmes are open to children of any age and are free for children eligible for free school meals. They will:

- Provide a safe and supportive environment for children
- Be led by experienced local coordinators teaming up with a range of different partners in their communities
- Serve children tasty and nutritious food and opportunities to learn about food and nutrition
- Organise lots of activities so every child can find something they enjoy from Kung Fu and cooking to bushcraft.
- Keep children and young people happy, healthy and active
- Offer a flexible childcare option for busy parents

Walthamstow International Film Festival 2021

The Walthamstow International Film Festival announces its 2020-2021 programme of short films to be screened on Saturday 10th July 2020 from 11.00am to 6pm at The Truman Social Club (1 Priestley Way, London E17 6AL).

With over 70 films from Walthamstow and from international entrants, the festival returns after the postponement of its 2020 event to a new home in the recently opened Truman Social Club at the heart of the Blackhorse Road creative hub.

This year, the programme of Animation, Documentary, Drama, Experimental and U18 short films of 5 minutes and under show a huge range in the filmmakers and in the way that creatives have risen to the challenge of producing festival standard work under lockdown restrictions; a theme which is expressed through shooting choices (using smartphones or technology to hand) and in the content.

"We're so impressed with the way that filmmakers have managed to produce outstanding work", says **Paul Fletcher**, Founder/Director of the entry level festival, which has been running since 2010. "We're also thrilled to be in our new screening home at Truman Social Club, where we are able to show festival regulars and new and emerging talent."

There will be a break at 15.30 to show a feature length documentary by artist Nancy Willis. This will be followed by a Q&A chaired by Walthamstow literary legend, "Other Teresa".

Says Liza Fletcher, Co-founder and Director, "We may not be able to invite our international entrants from Iran, North America, Japan, South Africa and Australia this year, but our festival volunteers will ensure that we interview film fans, filmmakers and audience members on our **@e17filmfestival** account on Instagram and other social channels.
