These start of year meetings will be in addition to parents evenings which we feel have gone well as virtual online events and have received positive feedback from parents as a more convenient way to meet with teachers to discuss your child's progress.

Covid update

We have had to send a small number of students home to self-isolate following positive covid tests among a handful of students in school. This is very frustrating for those affected and I am sorry that we have to do this. The government will end the requirement for students to be in bubbles soon which means that in September we will not be restricted in this way. We are, however, being asked to test students twice using lateral flow tests on their return to school in September. We will provide more details nearer the time once we have had further guidance from the government.

Chaplaincy Corner

St Augustine Zhao Rong, Priest and companions, Martyrs, whose Feast Day is celebrated on 9 July, has a different history from usual in that the 120 martyrs in this group died between 1648 and 1930.

87 of the martyrs were born in China and were children, parents, catechists or labourers, ranging in age from nine years to 72, including four Chinese diocesan priests. The 33 foreign-born martyrs were mostly priests or women religious.

The one named Saint, Augustine Zhao Rong, was a Chinese soldier who accompanied a Bishop of the Paris Foreign Mission Society to his martyrdom in Beijing. The priest's holy example made such a deep impression on Augustine that he decided to convert to Catholicism. Not long after his baptism, Augustine was ordained a diocesan priest. He was martyred in 1815.

Christianity arrived in China by way of Syria in the 600s. Depending on China' relations with the outside world, Christianity over the centuries was free to grow or was forced to operate secretly.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

We hope you are well and that your child/ren is enjoying the summer term and the warm weather!

Ahead of the summer holidays, we wanted to let you know about the brilliant new Holiday Activities and Food programme which is operating in your local area. We are helping to launch a new film to promote the programme so parents know that their children can get involved in a local holiday club when the school term ends this July.

We know that the holidays can be a really difficult time for families who are struggling to make ends meet or who are juggling work and childcare. The holidays should be a time for every child to enjoy themselves rather than worrying about having enough to eat or how they can spend their free time.

That's why we're really excited about the summer holiday programmes that are being funded by the Government and will take place across the whole of England. This was recommended by the National Food Strategy when it was published last year. A petition supporting the recommendation was signed by over 1 million people.

Places on the holiday schemes are available for free to children who receive free school meals, but children and young people of all ages and backgrounds are welcome to attend. Each local programme will provide delicious, healthy meals, allow kids to get active, help them learn new things, make friends and have fun. And that is what the holidays are all about!

The holiday programmes are open to children of any age and are free for children eligible for free school meals. They will:

- Provide a safe and supportive environment for children
- Be led by experienced local coordinators teaming up with a range of different partners in their communities
- Serve children tasty and nutritious food and opportunities to learn about food and nutrition
- Organise lots of activities so every child can find something they enjoy from Kung Fu and cooking to bushcraft.
- Keep children and young people happy, healthy and active
- Offer a flexible childcare option for busy parents

Walthamstow International Film Festival 2021

The Walthamstow International Film Festival announces its 2020-2021 programme of short films to be screened on Saturday 10th July 2020 from 11.00am to 6pm at The Truman Social Club (1 Priestley Way, London E17 6AL).

With over 70 films from Walthamstow and from international entrants, the festival returns after the postponement of its 2020 event to a new home in the recently opened Truman Social Club at the heart of the Blackhorse Road creative hub.

This year, the programme of Animation, Documentary, Drama, Experimental and U18 short films of 5 minutes and under show a huge range in the filmmakers and in the way that creatives have risen to the challenge of producing festival standard work under lockdown restrictions; a theme which is expressed through shooting choices (using smartphones or technology to hand) and in the content.

"We're so impressed with the way that filmmakers have managed to produce outstanding work", says **Paul Fletcher**, Founder/Director of the entry level festival, which has been running since 2010. "We're also thrilled to be in our new screening home at Truman Social Club, where we are able to show festival regulars and new and emerging talent."

There will be a break at 15.30 to show a feature length documentary by artist Nancy Willis. This will be followed by a Q&A chaired by Walthamstow literary legend, "Other Teresa".

Says Liza Fletcher, Co-founder and Director, "We may not be able to invite our international entrants from Iran, North America, Japan, South Africa and Australia this year, but our festival volunteers will ensure that we interview film fans, filmmakers and audience members on our @e17filmfestival account on Instagram and other social channels.
