The racist abuse that some of the players suffered afterwards was disgraceful and appalling and more needs to be done to eradicate this disgusting behaviour and remove the perpetrators from social media and hold them to account for their actions.

## Highlights of the summer term

Despite the challenges of covid it has been a busy and enjoyable summer term. I was especially pleased that we are able to run sports day, albeit in a different format to the usual whole school event. The students enjoyed it and there was some excellent competition and good sportsmanship shown.

It was also great to see Yr 7 so engaged in their mini-retreats and our thanks to the young people of Walsingham House for running these for us. We were also able to have a Leavers Mass for both Yr 11 and Yr 13 and our thanks to Canon Niall for celebrating these masses with us.

We did some really good work with the students on relationships and appropriate behaviour and inappropriate behaviour and on careers education which have been very well received. We want to ensure that all our young people behave appropriately towards each other and also that they start to think about their career choices and take advantage of the careers guidance which the school is able to offer.

## The new academic year

Our vision for the school and our aims for next year are all based around 'getting back to normal'. By this we mean being able to teach students really well in face to face lessons, being able to have a full range of liturgical activities and retreats in place for every year group and being able to run a full programme of extra-curricular activities including, I very much hope, competitive sports fixtures against other schools. We want all students to be engaged with the extra curricular programme and to really participate fully in the life of the school.

We want to get back to basics, to teaching really well, ensuring every student is engaged and happy and making sure that we set high expectations for everyone and aspire to be the best version of ourselves. That applies as much to staff as it does to students.

## LETTER FROM MARCUS RASHFORD MBE

Dear Parent/Guardian,

We hope you are well and that your child/ren is enjoying the summer term and the warm weather!

Ahead of the summer holidays, we wanted to let you know about the brilliant new Holiday Activities and Food programme which is operating in your local area. We are helping to launch a new film to promote the programme so parents know that their children can get involved in a local holiday club when the school term ends this July.

We know that the holidays can be a really difficult time for families who are struggling to make ends meet or who are juggling work and childcare. The holidays should be a time for every child to enjoy themselves rather than worrying about having enough to eat or how they can spend their free time.

That's why we're really excited about the summer holiday programmes that are being funded by the Government and will take place across the whole of England. This was recommended by the National Food Strategy when it was published last year. A petition supporting the recommendation was signed by over 1 million people.

Places on the holiday schemes are available for free to children who receive free school meals, but children and young people of all ages and backgrounds are welcome to attend. Each local programme will provide delicious, healthy meals, allow kids to get active, help them learn new things, make friends and have fun. And that is what the holidays are all about!

The holiday programmes are open to children of any age and are free for children eligible for free school meals. They will:

- Provide a safe and supportive environment for children
- Be led by experienced local coordinators teaming up with a range of different partners in their communities
- Serve children tasty and nutritious food and opportunities to learn about food and nutrition
- Organise lots of activities so every child can find something they enjoy from Kung Fu and cooking to bushcraft.
- Keep children and young people happy, healthy and active
- Offer a flexible childcare option for busy parents
