#### February is a month dedicated to the Holy Family.

We are all members of a family and the family is a source of love and support and sustenance. Family life has its ups and downs and families come in many different forms. The strength of families that they all share in common is that sense of love and belonging and a place where we are safe, loved and accepted for who we are. #### Aquinas Trust Mass

It has become one of our traditions that we come together with our Catholic primary partner schools - St Joseph's, St Patrick's and Our Lady and St George's to celebrate Mass together each March in the presence of student representatives from all of our schools. We last came together in March 2020 which was just before the first lockdown and last year were unable to do so. We are therefore delighted that on **Tuesday 1st March**, St David's day we shall be celebrating Mass together again at St Patrick's Parish Church. Thirty students of different ages will represent Holy Family.

#### Lent

The following day, **Wednesday 2nd March**, we find ourselves almost in the season of Lent. Lent is a season of fasting and almsgiving (charity), a spiritual cleansing and renewal to draw closer to God. We are encouraged to fast and to think of others – the main principle behind this is to move away from being self-centred to being centred on others. On Ash Wednesday there will be the distribution of ashes to all yeargroups during the school day. We shall be raising money for our House charities during the season of Lent and reflecting on all those who are in need at this time.

#### **Covid regulations update**

The government has published its plans for 'learning to live with covid' For us this means the following:

#### Self-isolation

- From Thursday 24th February, the government will remove the legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive test. However, adults and children who test positive **will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least five full days**, and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received two negative test results on consecutive days.
- Routine contact tracing **will end**. Neither vaccinated nor unvaccinated contacts will be required to self-isolate.
- More details can be found in the <u>Living with Covid-19</u> plan. Further detail will be published by the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) on Thursday 24 February and a link to this will be provided in the operational guidance for education settings on the same day.

#### Testing

- With immediate effect, the government has removed the guidance for staff and students in most education and childcare settings **to undertake twice-weekly asymptomatic testing**.
- Mainstream schools and colleges will be able to order tests if advised to do so in the event of an outbreak in the setting.
- All staff and students will continue to be able to access test kits from their local pharmacy or <u>online</u>.
- Anyone with symptoms should take a PCR test, stay at home and follow government guidance if positive. People who have tested positive will continue to be advised to stay at home for five full days and then receive two negative test results on consecutive days before returning to their workplace or setting.
- New DfE guidance on asymptomatic testing in education settings from 21 February 22 is available <u>here</u>.

We are hosting a further vaccination clinic on March 15th from period 5 until 4.30pm. This will be open to students aged 12-15 with parental consent, sixth formers and any staff who wish to make use of the service.

#### Parents' surgery

You can see me face to face in a socially distanced manner any week without an appointment on **Thursday afternoons between 4pm and 5pm.** If you prefer you can call the school office and arrange for me to call you instead. At present we have parents evenings for different yeargroups at this time which I am also involved in so you may wish to arrange a different time to see me. These will be finished by the middle of March.



## What Parents & Carers Need to Know about (NON-FUNGIBLE TOKENS)

A non-fungible token, or NFT, is a unique digital record of a particular file – such as an image, audio track or video (non-fungible meaning it can't be replaced by an identical item). NFTs let digital content producers like artists and designers control how their work is distributed and monetised. The offline equivalent would be owning a limited-edition art print, signed by the artist, with a certificate of authentication. The value of the tokens is incredibly volatile, unregulated and very much based on hype, publicity and marketing. These digital assets – typically collectibles, avatars for social media profiles or character add-ons for online games – are traded in specialised marketplaces using cryptocurrency.

### FAKE COLLECTIONS

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

When searching for a particular collection of NFTs, it is common for fake versions to display alongside the originals, which can easily fool a less experienced buyer. Larger projects will be verified, but small ones will not, so check the volume that has been traded and check the activity to verify authenticity – fake collections will have almost no trading history.

#### LACK OF CLARITY

Buying a limited-edition print of a painting isn't the same thing as owning the original. Likewise, when someone buys an NFT, they're not acquiring ownership rights to an original work. Some buyers don't realise that - since many NFTs are publicly on view - purchasing one doesn't stop other people from making their own copies of your NFT (by saving a screenshot of it, for example). Sneak peeks of NFTs can also falsely advertise what the purchaser is investing in, leaving buyers disappointed in what they actually receive, and as they are unregulated, there isn't a procedure for returns and refunds.

#### IP THEFT & "WASHTRADING"

Many online thieves steal NFTs to sell, while another common scam is "washtrading". Here, an unscrupulous trader creates aliases to buy the same NFT multiple times at increasing prices (so A sells to B for 10, who sells to C for 100, who then sells to D for 300 – except A, B, and C are actually all the same person). The goal is to lure in naïve speculators with the illusion of a juicy opportunity.

#### STORAGE ISSUES

An NFT is cryptocurrency which is linked to an additional file containing a digital asset. Due to the cost of storing data on a blockchain, it's typical for a project founder to store only the NFT's transaction record "on chain" to prove ownership – with the accompanying asset stored "off chain". Whether that storage is in the cloud or on a personal server, it must be permanently secure of the asset could be lost. So in a large number of cases, the NFT contains a link that points to the image data: it is not the image data itself.

#### TRANSACTION COSTS

Issuing an NFT requires "minting" it and any future sales require updating a blockchain ledger to transfer ownership. The cost of this – depending on the blockchain and market conditions – can vary wildly, based on supply and demand of "block space". In 2021, the fees paid for NFT transactions on one blockchain regularly cost more than the value of the asset itself, often by hundreds of US dollars.

#### PHISHING EMAILS & REPLICA SITES

There have been instances of messages being sent advertising the availability of new NFTs with a link to a fake website with a very similar URL to an authentic site. Users then link their cryptowallet to the site, are able to 'mint' the fake NFT, and once you press 'confirm', the cryptocurrency leaves your wallet and you are left without the NFT you were promised, and very much out of pocket.

### **Advice for Parents & Carers**

#### *HECK AUTHORSHIP*

Don't buy NFTs from unknown sources, and be wary of trading outside of official marketplaces. Branded NFTs, like those sold by sports franchises, are typically available via a platform that's easy to authenticate. However, NFTs sold by individual artists can be harder to verify. Research their online reputation to ensure they have a consistent track record of authorship and a recognised cryptocurrency wallet before you send a payment.

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WALLET SECURITY

Wallet security can be the difference between keeping NFTs secure and having them stolen. There are two primary types: a hot wallet (such as metamask) is used for minting NFTs and general day-to-day interactions with third-party sites. A cold wallet (or 'vault') is for storing high-value assets, as interactions can't take place without physical confirmation on the hardware. Only buy these from official sites and not from third-party sellers (including Amazon).

#### DON'T GAMBLE

Beginners should avoid investing significant sums of money and gambling on future NFT prices. Anyone can create NFTs: this potentially infinite supply of "limited-edition" collections means that, eventually, 99% of NFTs will likely be worth nothing. The market is largely based around building hype and making people believe that the next project will be the one that makes them rich. Take time over your decision and ensure you fully understand a project before getting involved.

#### SPOT THE SCAMS

Learn what type of message a hacker will leave. They'll often try to create the illusion that you're one of a select few who has this incredible, limited-time opportunity. These can appear on official pages via hacking, so be wary of this pressure-buying tactic. Hackers also send links outside official channels, such as on message boards and private messages. Turn off direct messaging from the server when you join, and never click links that aren't on a project's official page.

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


#### **Peace Club**



#### 16th May 1987 - 12th March 2012

Mark Cagaanan Aguhar was born in Houston, Texas in a Filipino American family. She attended the University of Texas at Austin and was an art student in the MFA program at the University of Illinois, Chicago. Aguhar's works include performance-based pieces, watercolours, collages, and photography.

Often the work was of self-portraits with hair extensions, make-up, gender-specific clothing and a beautiful, unashamed portrait of herself, curves and all and reminds the viewer that Aguhar's life and mere existence was an act of confronting white hegemony.

Mark was an American activist, writer and multimedia fine artist known for multidisciplinary work about gender, beauty and existing as a racial minority, while being body positive and transfeminine. Aguhar was made famous by her Tumblr blog that questioned mainstream representation of the "glossy glorification of the gay white male body".

She posted to Tumblr under the handle 'calloutqueen'. Critical theory and personal drama disillusioned Aguhar; in a self-consciously and self-critically politicised move she renamed her blog 'Blogging for Brown Gurls'. Here she dismissed whiteness, masculinity, thinness, and all things hegemonic while affirming brownness, femininity, and fatness.

Aguhar's 2011 video, "WHY BE UGLY WHEN U CAN BE BEAUTIFUL" demonstrates how - for someone whose everyday existence as a queer, transgender person is vulnerable to harassment and violence - the daily act of fixing one's hair can be a form of radical resistance. Aguhar created artwork that claims space for people who exist outside the gender binary, and insists on their right to lead fulfilling lives.

Mark's work is a continuous exploration of queer expression and what it means to have grown up gay on the internet. Aguhar collects visual artefacts from queer online communities and uses them in their work to define and redefine who they are and what their body is. Aguhar's work combines porn, fashion, textile patterns, optical effects, trans identities, and queer jokes. Aguhar demonstrated playful and colourful potentials in femininity.

"Here was someone who was unafraid to express themselves in the way that spoke to their experience. Mark did not seek to express or explain the lives of people who lived outside the gender binary." (Simon Thibault).

"My work is about visibility. My work is about the fact that I'm a genderqueer person of colour fat femme fag feminist and I don't really know what to do with that identity in this world. It's that thing where you grew up learning to hate every aspect of yourself and unlearning all that misery is really hard to do." (Mark Aguhar)

Mark was only months away from earning her degree from University of Illinois at Chicago when she died by suicide in Chicago. Since then, there is a "Mark Aguhar Memorial Grant" available through Chances Dances for queer artists of colour.




