#### War in Ukraine

Like everyone you will have been horrified to see and hear what is happening in Ukraine following the Russian invasion. We all thought we would never again see such scenes in Europe but the capacity of man (and it is almost always man) to wage war and destruction is frightening. We stand with our brothers and sisters in Ukraine and are supporting those members of our school community who are Ukrainian or have relatives in Ukraine. We prayed for peace on Wednesday and will be offering practical support to the Ukrainian people too. We will be inviting staff, students and parents to contribute humanitarian aid and we shall collect this in school. More information on this will be announced next week.

#### **The Aquinas Trust Mass**

Tuesday was St David's day, patron saint of Wales. Fr Kevin celebrated Mass at St Patrick's Church and we were joined by pupils from St Joseph's in Leyton, OLSG in Walthamstow and St Patrick's in Blackhorse Rd. It was a lovely occasion and Fr Kevin reminded us all to think about giving up our phones, computer games and other digital devices this Lent.



#### **Ash Wednesday**

Our thanks to Mr Norman, Mrs Grierson, our lay chaplain and other colleagues for leading our services and the distribution of ashes to all students. Mr Norman spoke about the three pillars of Lent - prayer. fasting and charitable works and there was much for us all to reflect upon. The following day students had the opportunity to receive the sacrament of reconciliation and we are grateful to the priests of the deanery for making time to be with us. Students on the lower site will have this opportunity next week. My whole school video assembly took up this theme looking at the idea that lent is a time for us all to reflect on the things that we do wrong, the hurt we cause to others and the need in all of us for God's mercy and love.

#### Parties, parenting and the power of saying 'no'

Parenting isn't easy. Our young people push boundaries and test us. They will sometimes say that 'everybody else is allowed to do something so why can't I?' Some students attend parties on the weekends where there may be alcohol, drugs and little or no adult supervision. Often these parties do not end well. They are not a good idea for students to be attending. Please have the confidence as parents to say 'no'. Not every student does get allowed to go to parties or do whatever they like however much our own children complain to us that 'everyone else is allowed to do' whatever it is.






# Time away from technology







#### ST DAVID'S DAY

St David: a brief history

St David was the greatest figure in the 6th century Welsh Age of Saints, founder of scores of religious communities, and the only native-born patron saint of the countries of Britain and Ireland.

St David died on 1 March - St David's Day - in 589.

He was canonised by Pope Callixtus in the 12th century, and we have celebrated St David's Day ever since.

Usually, St David's Day is a day of parades, concerts and eisteddfodau (festivals of music, language and culture). Flags are flown. The national anthem is sung with extra fervour. Children go to school in traditional Welsh dress, and everyone (well, almost...) proudly pins a daffodil or leek to their lapel.
















































# TEXTILES

#### Ingredients:

#### Pastry

150g plain flour 25g/1tbsp fine caster or icing sugar 75g butter, diced

1 egg yolk

A splash ice-cold water, if needed Replace egg with 1 1/2 tbsp ice-cold water to make egg free

Filling: In groups of 3-4

#### For the crème pâtissière

500ml milk 6 egg yolks 40g plain flour 125g caster sugar

a little icing sugar to dust

#### To finish:

½ jar apricot jam 400g fresh fruit, such as raspberries, pineapple, strawberries and grapes

#### Method:

- For the pastry, sift the flour into the mixing bowl and sugar in a mixing bowl until well combined. Tip in the butter cubes and rub in with your fingers until the mixture resembles
- 2. Separate the egg yolk, then beat with fork in small bowl. Add the beaten egg to the pastry and work together with your hands until the pastry comes together. You may need to add a splash of ice-cold water if the pastry is too dry. Wrap in cling film and leave to rest in the fridge for at least ten minutes.
- Preheat the oven to 180C/350F/Gas 4. Wash and prepare fruits.
- Remove the pastry from the fridge and peel off the cling film. Roll the pastry out on a wellfloured surface to a thickness of about 5mm/¼in.
- Cut circles of the pastry out with a cutter that's only slightly bigger than a set of 10cm/4in tart cases. Carefully line the miniature tart cases, ensuring that you overlap the edge a little. Alternatively, lay the pastry on the top of the barquette tins and roll over using a rolling pin over the tart case to cut them to shape - this should cut the pastry exactly the same size as the case. Then press the pastry into the tart tin with your fingers / a small ball of dough.
- 6. Prick the base of the pastry with a fork. Line the pastry case(s) with a square of aluminium foil / grease proof paper and fill with ceramic baking beans or raw rice.
- Place all the cases in the oven and bake for about 15 minutes, or until cooked and crisp all the way through. Remove the beans and foil lining and set aside the cases to cool on a cooling rack. Then remove from the tins and set aside.
- For the crème pâtissière, heat the milk in a large pan until it is just boiling.
- 9. Thoroughly whisk together the egg yolks, plain flour and sugar in a bowl. Pour the milk into the bowl containing the eggs while whisking to combine. Pour the entire mixture back into the pan and cook over a medium heat while stirring constantly. The mixture should thicken as it just comes to the boil.
- 10. Remove from the heat and transfer to a glass bowl to cool. At this point sprinkle over a little icing sugar to stop a skin from forming. Place the glass bowl into a water bath.
- 11. Pass the jam through a sieve into a clean bowl to make it smooth. Heat up the apricot jam with two tablespoons of hot water and leave to cool.
- 12. Spoon a little of the cooled crème pâtissière into each one of the tart cases. Top with fruits before brushing lightly with the cooled apricot jam.

#### INTRODUCING THE HALO CODE

We are excited to announce that Holy Family Catholic School has adopted The Halo Code, the UK's first Black hair code.

No Black staff or students should have to change their natural or protective hairstyle in order to thrive at our school.

We hope that the Halo Code will move us one step closer to a world free from discrimination, where all Black members of our community have their identities fully recognised and celebrated.

#### The Code:

"Our school champions the right of staff and students to embrace all Afro-hairstyles. We acknowledge that Afro-textured hair is an important part of our Black staff and students' racial, ethnic, cultural, and religious identities, and requires specific styling for hair health and maintenance.
