Dear Parent/Carer

I am writing to update on the start of the school year, and to let you know about some changes to our routines.

Routines and reminders

As a split-site school, it is important that we have a coherent approach across both upper and lower sites, so that our high expectations for behaviour and learning are consistent.

On the upper and lower sites, the following apply:

- **Line-ups:** Students in Years 7-10 line up at the start of the day, after break and after lunch. They are collected by teachers and accompanied to lessons. This ensures orderly movement around the buildings and a smooth start to lessons. Many of the school buildings are old and corridors are narrow, so safe movement is essential.
- Mobile phones: Students in Years 7-11 are forbidden to bring mobile phones into school. If found they will be confiscated and only returned to a parent/carer after two weeks.

- Students who persistently breach the school's uniform rules will be placed in the Bethany Room until the issue is resolved.

Our expectations for behaviour

Our approach to behaviour is summed up in three words: Ready, Respectful, Safe. We expect all students to be ready to learn, respectful of themselves, other students and their teachers and to conduct themselves in a safe way both in and out of school, and online.

The vast majority of our students show exemplary behaviour both in and out of lessons and we expect our students to represent us positively whilst they are wearing our uniform on their way to and from school.

However, when behaviour falls below our high standards sanctions will be applied, including suspension from school. This is not something that we do lightly - nevertheless for serious breaches we will always issue a suspension.

Headteacher's surgeries

Parents and carers are welcome to attend the weekly Headteacher's surgery, which takes place every Thursday 4pm to 5pm on the Walthamstow site. No appointment is required although you may wish to let the office know ahead of time, so that a time slot can be arranged.

As a Catholic school we recognise that parents are the first educators of the child, and we value your support immensely. Thank you for your ongoing commitment to the school - I look forward to meeting you over the coming weeks at our upcoming events.
