SPANISH

A Level Course

Description

This is an advanced level course in Spanish, so you will be expected to be interested in different cultures and keen to use Spanish to understand and to communicate your own ideas and opinions to others on different topics and issues.

This course expects you to be able to develop knowledge and understanding of the social issues and trends and political and artistic culture of Spain and Spanish-speaking countries. You will need to express and justify your own opinions, develop arguments, and persuade, in speech and writing, building on the fluency and spontaneity developed at Key Stages 4. The skill of translation will be developed further.

This qualification offers a suitable progression route to further study at university level. In addition, the study of one language at GCE can facilitate and help promote the learning of other languages.

Entry Requirements

GCSE Average: 4.8. GCSE grade 5 in English, grade 7 in Spanish and / or Home Spoken Language.























You can progress to a wide range of careers in areas such as **journalism and media**, **education**, **science**, **medicine**, **the civil service**, **sales**, **marketing**, **retail**, **and charities**. You will be able to apply your knowledge, skills and understanding to authentic, real-life contexts.

You will develop transferable skills that support study of other GCE subjects, higher education study, and the transition to employment, together with an understanding and appreciation of Spanish-speaking countries and their cultures.

The qualification may also add to your employability profile, particularly for UK organisations trading overseas as well as with international companies based in the UK and globally.
