







Why study at Holy Family?


- Excellent Post-16 results and a high success rate of entry to top universities.
- Outstanding pastoral support from a dedicated team with a sharp focus on the holistic growth of the individual student.
- A strong Catholic ethos with an emphasis on service to others.
- Growing numbers, but still small enough that we know each student as an individual. Smaller classes than GCSE in the vast majority of cases.
- Students are treated as young adults with the trust and responsibility that that entails eg: Tutorials.
- We are truly comprehensive in other words there is a pathway for you at Holy Family, irrespective of the grades you achieve. We will not turn you away if you do not get grade 6's and above!





Catholic Ethos

Core curriculum offer: Level 3 subjects

A Levels

- Linear two year courses with external exams at the end of Year 13.
- Some coursework elements eg: Art, Photography, Design etc.
- Students choose 3 or 4 subjects depending on GCSE average.

Level 3 BTECs

- 2 year courses, mainly based on assignment work.
- Less examined content than A Levels (approximately 30-40%).
- Equivalent to between 1 to 2 A Levels, depending on subject weighting.
- Students choose 2 subjects to study.

Mixed programmes

• It is possible to study a number of mixed combinations – these can be discussed at interview.









Curriculum offer: Bridging course

- The Holy Family ethos is to support students of all abilities.
- We therefore offer a bridging course for internal students who do not meet the entry requirements for Level 3 study by September 2019.
- The aim of this course is to allow students another year to prepare for their chosen pathway and to provide extra pastoral/careers support.
- The focus is therefore on either:
 - Re-sitting Maths and English GCSE's if a grade 3 is achieved, with a view to progressing to Level 3 study in September 2020.
 - Accessing stepping stone qualifications if grade 1 or 2 is achieved to progress to apprenticeships or further training in September 2020.
- Please do not hesitate to ask the sixth form team for more details on this pathway.







Entry requirements

- A Levels and Level 3 BTECs require a high level of prior knowledge and skills, as demonstrated through GCSE results.
- As a result, we advertise clear entry requirements for each course. These
 are explained in full on the Curriculum Offer document in your prospectus.
- Students who narrowly miss entry requirements will be considered on an individual basis, based on circumstance.
- General requirements for A Level are a GCSE average of 4.8 or greater and grade 5 in Maths and English GCSE.
- General requirements for Level 3 BTEC are GCSE average of 3.6 and grade 4 in Maths and English.
- Some subjects also have specific requirements eg: Maths A Level requires a grade 7 or greater in Maths GCSE.









GCSE Averages – examples


• Example student who qualifies for A Levels: Maths: 5, English: 5, Science double: 55, RE: 5, History: 6, French: 6, Resistant Materials: 6, Media Studies: 7 = 50/9 = GCSE average 5.6

• Example student who qualifies for L3 BTEC: Maths: 4, English 4, Science double: 44, RE: 4, History: 5, French: 4, Resistant Materials: 4, Media Studies: 5 = 34/9 = GCSE average 3.8

• These entry requirements mirror other similar providers and in some cases are more lenient







Study programmes

- Core curriculum of: Level 3 Academic/Vocational Qualifications or Level 2 Bridging course Continued Level 2 English and/or maths.
 - GCSE booster classes for November or May entry.
 - Functional Skills classes to focus on core skills.
- Additional supporting qualifications such as Extended Project Qualification (EPQ), Core Maths and community based languages.
- General Religious Studies programme.
- Super-curricular activities.
- Community enrichment activities.
- Tutorials and extended registration/PSD drop down days.
- Timetabled study sessions.
- Opportunities for work placements, speakers and subject based trips.





The application process

- Please complete all sections of the form accurately some helpful hints:
 - Please upload a formal passport sized photo
 - It is vitally important to inform us of any medical, dietary, SEN or other needs
 - For **external students** the ULN, UPN & UCI numbers are essential (current Holy Family students we have these already)
 - Current predicted grades should be accurate and confirmed by your referee
 - Please carefully follow the instructions regarding subject choices (you should only choose one subject from each of the option blocks more on this later)
 - Once you have entered your grades, subject options will be tailored to your current predictions

Important issues

- We would strongly advise that students calculate a predicted GCSE average from their most recent Mock exam results.
- This should be used as a guide as to the most suitable pathway in sixth form.
 These averages will be discussed at interview.
- All offers made are conditional on meeting the entry requirements of specific pathways.









Option Blocks

- These form the basis for creating the timetable for September 2019.
- Students applying for **A Levels** should choose a minimum of 3 subjects and should choose one option from each block (A,B,C,D) only.
- At this stage you can also register interest in EPQ or Core Maths in Block E
- Students with a GCSE average score of 6.5 or above would be advised to start on 4 A Levels. This will be discussed at interview and enrolment.
- Students applying for Level 3 BTEC subjects should choose one subject from BTEC Block A and one subject from BTEC Block B.
- There is the potential to study a **mixed programme** of A Level and L3 BTECs. Students must still qualify for A Levels in order to study a mixed programme. In this case please choose one A Level subject in Block C alongside the B choice in Block A.

Interviews and offers for sixth form


- All applicants will receive an interview this is not something to be worried about BUT please ensure you come ready to discuss why you are applying for your chosen subjects.
- Any offer that is made takes into consideration:
 - Your Practice/Mock exam results
 - Your current teacher predictions
 - Your attendance and punctuality
 - Teacher reference
- There are two levels of offer:
- 1) Firm conditional (a firm offer based on meeting the specific entry requirements).
- 2) Pending conditional (Internal students will be required to complete the 'Passport to Sixth Form').

FAQs – why do you place so much emphasis on Maths and English GCSEs?

- Other than the fact they are vital for career progression (Universities and employers take the grades very seriously)...
- ...the government has made it compulsory for students Post-16 to continue to work towards a grade 4 if they do not gain this at the end of Year 11.
- We offer intensive revision classes for GCSE re-sits and stepping stone qualifications for those under grade 3.
- Re-sitting maths and English while studying a full Level 3 programme is extremely difficult and can result in underachievement across the student's study programme.
- Maths and English skills underpin all Level 3 subjects they are also the best predictor of success at Level 3 and beyond.







FAQs – what are the best subject combinations?


- Our best advice is for students to choose subjects that interest and motivate them.
- There are some combinations of subjects which are essential for some careers eg: Chemistry plus other sciences for Medicine.
- Other career paths require clusters of similar subjects we can advise more on this either formally at interview or informally at any time – please contact us if you have any questions.
- If you are not sure on a career path refer to point one above!
- Subject combinations will be discussed at interview.
- Russell Group Universities often require a minimum of two facilitating subjects (Search for Informed Choices – Russell Group).

FAQs – can Level 3 BTECs get me to university?

- The overwhelmingly simple answer is yes!
- And we know this because we send many students each year to university with multiple Dist and Dist* grades (the equivalent to A and A* grades at A Level).
- Over 70% of university courses give offers using the UCAS Tariff, which includes a wide range of different course types
- They are highly valued by employers we know this because they tell us so!
- They are suited to students who have a particular vocation in mind and/or who prefer less examined content.
- Recent govt. reforms have made L3 BTECS more academically rigorous with up to 40% examined content in some subjects.










FAQs – can I take a subject that I didn't do at GCSE?

FAQs – What can parents do to help?

- Emphasising the importance of The Year 11 Practice/Mock exams these are crucial in determining the type of offer that students will gain especially in terms of effort/attitude to learning.
- Ensuring students have a quiet study space.
- Making sure students are organised.
- Encouraging students to take rest breaks!
- Give guidance and help in choosing subjects BUT recognising that it is the student's choice in the end.
