



We are a family of many cultures sharing one faith.


We exist to **<u>educate all young people towards excellence in all</u>** <u>**dimensions of their lives,** recognising the uniqueness of each and the equality of all.</u>

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Partnership is a collaborative relationship between two or more parties based on trust, equality and mutual understanding for the achievement of a specified goal







#### **Our School Rules (p.15)**



- Go straight home at the end of the school day (unless attending a study club or other extracurricular activity), avoiding Walthamstow Central unless it is an essential part of their journey
- Students are prohibited from being present in the Walthamstow shopping mall whilst wearing school uniform

## Education is vital – you only get one chance – hence all students MUST:

- 1. ALWAYS show respect for others. This means having due regard for the feelings, wishes and rights of others, both face to face and online.

- 3. ALWAYS listen to your teacher and to others who contribute in lessons.
- 4. BRING correct equipment to all lessons
- 5. ALWAYS produce your very best classwork and homework
- 6. ALWAYS wear correct school uniform to, from and in school. Coats, hats, scarves, gloves etc are not to be worn in lessons.

#### **READY, RESPECTFUL, SAFE**



Our rules are very simple. All students are expected to be:

**READY** to learn: on time to school and lessons; all equipment out at the start of each lesson; uniform worn correctly; listening to instructions from teachers

**RESPECTFUL** of themselves, their teachers and their peers: complying with instructions first time; listening when others are speaking; being prepared to accept others' views; not using hurtful or offensive language to or about others; treating others in the community with respect, on their way to and from school

**SAFE** both in and out of lessons: following instructions carefully; entering and leaving the building sensibly; behaving in a safe way in the corridors, playgrounds and canteen





*Optional additional summer task*: write your very own spooky ghost story.


