



#### What is **safeguarding**?

Safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children is defined for the purposes of this guidance as:

- protecting children from maltreatment
- preventing the impairment of children's mental and physical health or development
- ensuring that children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care, and
- taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes.





#### Whose **responsibility** is it? What does this **mean**?



Safeguarding is **everyone's** responsibility.

- All staff have responsibility to provide a safe environment in which children can learn.
- School and college staff are particularly important, as they are in a position to identify concerns early, provide help for children, promote children's welfare and prevent concerns from escalating.

# We know... What happens in secondary school shapes your future.

# That the decisions you make now play a crucial role in determining your future.





## We know... That disruptive behaviour in the classroom creates gaps in your learning and this will affect your grades.



#### We know...

## That disruption leads to underachievement and underachievement has lasting consequences.



#### What is disruption? If a student's behaviour causes the teacher to interrupt the flow of the lesson so that the whole class ceases to be taught for a measurable period of time, the lesson has been disrupted. ASPIRE 'Aspire not to have more, but to be more.'



#### **Behaviours that stop teachers teaching**

- Arriving late to class
- Not having the right equipment
- Not sitting in their correct seat
- Being slow to settle
- Talking whilst the teacher is talking
- Calling out
- Not having done homework



#### **Behaviours that stop teachers teaching**

- Not following instructions
- Answering back or questioning the instruction
- Making noise to gain attention
- Moving around the class without permission
- Fidgeting or fiddling with equipment

#### Anything that holds up the important business of teaching and learning! SPIRE



#### What you may initially see as trivial misdemeanours have a severe accumulative effect, particularly when presented with persistent acts by one or more students.



## **Research says that...**

Students are potentially losing up to an hour of learning each day in schools because of 'low level disruption' in classrooms. This is equivalent to 38 days of teaching lost per year.

## **Actions have consequences**

No student is permitted to stop their teacher from teaching and

their class from learning whether that is with your regular

teacher or with a cover teacher - the expectation is the same.

#### Any student who disrupts the lesson will be removed immediately.

They will also be sanctioned with a one-hour detention at the end of the school day and their parent will receive a text about the lesson removal.




